#### FROM THE EDITORS:

Autumn brought a good showing of wanderers we rarely see. New Mexico's second Swainson's Warbler was photographed. Other rarities included a Buff-breasted Sandpiper, an adult Sabine's Gull, a Gray Hawk, a Black-billed Cuckoo, 2 Groovebilled Anis, Varied and Wood Thrushes, a very unusual White-eyed Vireo, and a Lawrence's Goldfinch.

Unusual activity of our regular species may have been more significant. Seven Tundra Swans were a good number. Black-shouldered Kites widened their range to the Las Cruces area and to Pinon, in northern Otero County. Massive downhill movements of corvids and Mountain Chickedees were notable, and small groups of Red-breasted Nuthatches were widespread in the lowlande. Red Knots were reported twice. An impressive 27 species of warblers included the rare Prothonotary, Worm-esting, Kentucky, and 3 Black-throated Greens. Many warblers lingered, some into November.

<u>4,498 SOUTH-BOUND RAPTORS IDENTIFIED</u> -- Hawkwatch International's autumn 1989 count of southward-migrating raptors was done at Capilla Peak in the Manzano Mountains, August 28-October 31, with Brett Ewald and Tim Menard in charge. TAXONOMY -- Changes in American Ornithologists' Union check list:

Neotropic Cormorant (Phelacrocorax brasilianus) is the new name of our former Olivaceous Cormorant (Phalacrocorax olivaceous), reflecting preferred usage of specialists on the species.

New information places the Prairie Falcon immediately ahead of the Peregrine Falcon in taxonomic order. It formarly followed the Peregrine.

LEAST SANDPIPER -- High counts were 50+ at Bitter L. and 200+ 8/15 (PJ); 100 at Elephant Butte L. 10/21 (PSt), 40 near Alamogordo 8/14 (PJ), and 50+ at Holloman L. 9/20 (CSa).

WHITE-RUMPED SANDPIPER \_\_\_\_\_ Singles at Bitter L. 9/23 (DC) and at Loving 8/2 (SW).

BAIRD'S SANDPIPER -- 10 on 8/20-27 at Black Rock (DC);3 near El Malpais NM 9/2 (JH); 15 on 8/1 (PJ) and 6 on 8/26 (RSCT) at Bosque NWR; and, by CSa, 13 at Old Refuge 9/21, 15 to 20 at Holloman L. 8/14, 16, and 8 there 9/20.

PECTORAL SANDPIPER -- 4 at Springer L. 10/4 (CSa); 8 at Zunl 10/1 (OC); 1 at Grasslands turf farm 9/14 (LG), and 2 each by CSs at Percha Dam 9/30 and at Holloman L. 10/2.

OUNLIN -- 1 at Zuni 9/9 (OC) and 3 at Elephant Butte L. 10/22 (PSt).

STILT SANDPIPER -- Singles at Zuni 9/9 (DC), at Santa Fe in September (CR+), and at Bitter L. 10/21 (SW). 10 to 14 at Bitter L. 8/15 and 18 (PJ, DC) and 1 there 10/21 (SW). 4 to 8 at Holloman L. 8/14 and 16 (PJ, CSa) and 7 on 9/22 (BZ).

BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER -- unusual:1 at Holloman L. 9/20 (CSa).

SHORT-BILLED DOWITCHER -- 2 on 8/20 at Black Rock Dam (DC), and 2 at Bitter L. 8/16 and 9/16-20 (PJ).

LONG-BILLED DOWITCHER -- High counts were 8 at Maxwell NWR on 9/18 (WH), 12 to 43 at Bosque NWR 8/1, 8/10, 8/26 and 9/21 (PJ, RT+), and 30 at Bitter L. 8/15 (PJ).

COMMON SNIPE -- 6 on 10/1 and 1 on 11/15 at Black Rock Oam (DC); 4 at Bosque NWR 11/10-12 (SWi, KC); first 2 on 10/25 at Mangas Springs were fewer than in previous years (RF).

<u>RED-NECKED PHALAROPE</u> -- 2 at Black Rock Dam on 8/27 (DC); 8 in winter plumage at Bosque NWR 8/30 and 3 or 4 there on 9/21 and 24 (LG, JB1, OC); 22 to \$1 at Bitter L. 9/13 and 23 (PJ, JS, DC).

RED PHALAROPE -- 1 possible at Las Vegas NWR 9/24 (CR).

SABINE'S GULL -- 1 immature at Black Rock Reservoir 1D/1 (DC); more unusual was an adult at Bosque NWR 9/24 (DC).

<u>COMMON TERN</u> -- 1 immature at Chuska L. 9/16 (DC); 4 reported from Storrie L. 8/31 (PSt), but details did not fully eliminate molting adult Forster's Terns.

FORSTER'S TERN \_-- Small numbers statewide from 8/8 to 10/13(v.0.).

LEAST TERN -- 4 at Bitter L. 8/2-3 (SWi).

<u>BLACK TERN</u> -- Reported from Zuni and eastward from the Rio Grande Valley from 8/1 to 9/20. High counts, 42 at Las Vegas NWR 9/16 (CR) and 100+ at Bitter L. 9/13 (PJ, JD).

LAUGHING GULL -- 2 at Brantley L. 8/15 (PJ) well seen and described.

<u>FRANKLIN'S GULL</u> -- 1 at Mexwell NWR 10/4 (CSa) and 1 at Bitter L. 9/13 (PJ, JS) were the only reports.

BONAPARTE'S GULL -- 1 at Zuni 11/4 (DC); 1 at Caballo L. 11/3 (PJ).

<u>CALIFORNIA GULL</u> -- 40+ at Heron L. 8/17 (JH); 1 at Maxwell NWR 9/18 (WH). <u>HERRING GULL</u> -- 1 at Las Vegas NWR 10/4 (CSa); 1 at Las Vegas NWR (no

date) (CR); 1 at Percha Dam 11/26 (DM).

(Corrections: Sabine's Gull should follow Herring Gull; terms should follow gulls.)

BAND-TAILED PIGEON -- 1 to 3 at a feeder in Gila Bird Habitat 8/24-9/17 (SM) were migrants at low elevation.

<u>WHITE-WINGED DOVE</u> -- <u>unusual:</u> One wandered north to the Sandia Mts. (Piedra Lisa trailhead) 8/29 (HS).

INCA DOVE -- unusual: Singles at Zuni 10/22 (DC) and at Mangas Springs 11/25-30 (RF) were out of range....Above-usual numbers were 6 in a group at Socorro 11/29 (JS) and 8 at Owen's farm 10/28 (CSa).

COMMON GROUND DOVE -- unusual: Singles seen as far north as Sevilleta NWR 10/26 (RT) and photographed at Socorro 11/4-18 (JS, PJ).

BLACK-BILLED CUCKOD -- unusual: 1 at Rattleenake Springs 9/15 (JS, PJ, with photos). Scarce in N.M.

YELLOW-BILLED CUCKOO -- breeding: A pair fledged young at Mangas Springs in August (RF)....1 at Rio Grande Nature Center 10/28 )LG) was late.

<u>GROOVE-BILLED ANI</u> -- unusual: 1 with details at Bosque NWR 11/25 (Joe Ten Brink). An injured bird found near Gila 11/23 died during the night. Specimen sent to University of New Mexico collection (RF, SM).

BARN OWL -- 1 or 2 at Maxwell NWR 8/3 (OC) and 2 there 9/17 (CR); singles at Oripping Springs 11/24 (CSa) and Bell L. 9/15 (PJ, JS).

FLAMMULATED OWL -- 1 in Hawner Canyon, Cibola County, 9/29 (DC).

WESTERN SCREECH\_OWL--- 1 along Canadian R. néar Mills 9/25 (Robert Dickerman).

NORTHERN PYGMY OWL 1 heard at Aguirre Springs 9/29 (CSa); possibly a first for Organ Mts.

<u>SPOTTED OWL</u> -- <u>unusual</u>: 1 at upper Juan Tabo Canyon 8/8, 15 (HS), same location as previous year; 1 at San Simon Cienega 10/31 (Robert Dickerman).

LONG-EARED OWL -- unusual: 1 heard et Black River village 10/14 (CR, PSn, Evan Spiegel).

SHORT-EARED OWL -- unusual: 1 at Coyote Springs, Socorro County, 9/21 (TH, BrH).

'89-4 (autumn '89)

COMMON NIGHTHAWK -- 1 at Espanola 9/23 (CR, PI+) was late.

LESSER NIGHTHAWK -- 1 at Black River Village 10/14-15 (CR) was also late.

CHAETURA species -- 1 flying over San Simon Ciegega 9/16-17 (BH).

WHITE-THROATED SWIFT -- unusual: 5 at Bandelier NM 10/8 (CR) were late.

MAGNIFICENT HUMMINGBIRD -- A female at Mangas Springs feeder 8/23 (RF).

<u>RUFOUS HUMMINGBIRD</u> -- Several at Clayton feeders during the period (WC); 1 immature male at Albuquerque feeder 10/13-11/7 (Bill Willard) and a male at Socorro feeder 11/8 (PJ) were latest stragglers reported.

<u>ALLEN'S HUMMINGBIRD</u> -- 1 thought to be of this species was seen at Truth or Consequences 9/10-12 (DSJM). Species is very difficult to identify in the field, and has not been definitely documented in New Mexico, though it could very possibly be here.

<u>LEWIS' WOODPECKER</u> -- More reports than usual from south of Albuquerque; up to 5 deily at the Capilla Paak raptor watch in September and October (Brett twald, Tim Menerd)....1 on 10/23 (PJ, JS) and 2 on 10/29 (PB) at Socorro; singles at San Antonio 10/7 (PJ, JS), at Bosque NWR 10/12 (SWi) and at San Simon Cienega 10/27 (SM).

RED-HEADED WOODPECKER -- A juvenal at Bitter L. 9/23 and 1 near Caprock 10/11 (PJ).

ACORN WOODPECKER -- unusual:1 at Placitas 10/19 (Jim McPhee); records from Sandias are rare...Singlas at Capilla Peak 9/1 (Brett Ewald, Tim Menard) and 9/15 (PSt), at Mangas Springs 9/6 (RF), at Clanton Canyon 11/3 (PJ), at Oripping Springs 10/18 (KSk, EW), and at Cloudcroft 9/15 (JS, PJ).

<u>RED-NAPED SAPSUCKER -- unusual:</u> 2 adults and 1 immature at Sevilleta NWR 10/12 (RT); first records on the refuge.

WILLIAMSON'S SAPSUCKER -- <u>unusual</u>: A female 11/7<sub>1</sub> (RT) at Bosque NWR, where irregular in migration. An adult male at Rattlesnake Springs 10/15, --28 (ML, SW); only 5 records for Carlsbad Caverns NP.

DOWNY WOODPECKER -- i in Fourth of July Canyon, Manzano Mts., 10/7 (CSa) and 3 at Perche Dam SP 11/27 (DM) were in southern pert of range.

LAODER-BACKEO WOODPECKER -- 1 at Echo Amphitheater n. of Abiquiu L. 10/29 (CR), a northerly area.

STRICKLAND'S WOODPECKER -- 1 on 11/3 in Clanton Canyon, where seldom reported.

THREE-TDED WODDPECKER -- A pair in the Zuni Mts. (DC).

NORTHERN FLICKER -- In weaterly areas, single yellow-shafted forms were at Zuni 10/14 (DC), Bosque NWR 11/4, 17 (RT), and Durling's farm 11/12 (BZ).

<u>OLIVE-SIDED FLYCATCHER</u> -- Singles singing at Mills Canyon (Mora, Herding) 9/25=26 (JH), Oasis SP 9/14 (PJ, JS) and Mangas Springs 9/5 (RF).

<u>GREATER PEWEE</u> -- A possible example described from El Morro NM 9/7 (Dasn Sandee).

WILLOW FLYCATCHER -- 6 bended in Albuquerque 8/26-9/1 (CAH+).

LEAST FLYCATCHER -- A banding first in Albuquerque 8/13 (CAH+). 1 at Boone's Draw 9/14 (PJ, JS).

DUSKY/HAMMOND'S FLYCATCHER -- 1 at Bandelier NM 10/8 (CR) was late.

HAMMOND'S FLYCATCHER -- 5 banded in Albuquerque 9/9-17 (CAH+).

DUSKY FLYCATCHER- 31 bended in Albuquerque 8/19-9/19 (CAH+).

GRAY FLYCATCHER -- 3 banded in Albuquerque 8/19-9/10 (CAH+). 1 seen et Boone's Draw 9/13-14 (PJ, JS).

'89-4 (autumn '89)

CORDILLERAN FLYCATCHER -- 2 at Boone's Oraw 9/13 (PJ, JS).

EASTERN PHOEBE -- 2 at Las Vegas NWR 9/12, 16 (CR), 2 at Bitter L. 9/13 (JS, PJ), and 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 10/15 (SW).

VERMILION FLYCATCHER -- A first-year male at Albuquerque 9/18 (LG) was

a straggler.

CASSIN'S KINGBIRD -- Last at Mangas Springs in mid-October (RF).

WESTERN KINGBIRD -- 1 over 9,000 feet in San Juan Mts. 8/17 (JH) and 1 late at Zuni 10/8 (DC).

EASTERN KINGBIRD -- Highs at Maxwell NWR were 30+ on 8/3 (DC) and 18 on 8/11 (CR). 1\*\* vagrant at Mangas Springs 9/4 (RF).

NORTHERN ROUGH-WINGED SWALLOW -- Lingering were 1 at Española 9/23 (PI+) and 5 at Bosque NWR 10/5 (PS, RT).

BANK SWALLOW -- High count at Las Vegas NWR, 100+ on 8/10 (CR).

<u>CAVE SWALLOW</u> -- At Cerlsbad Caverns NP, about 3,000 in early August, 1,500 on 19/25, and 15 on 11/8 (SW).

<u>STELLER'S JAY</u> -- <u>unusual</u>: A state-wide massive invasion occurred this fall, with most observers commenting on the high numbers. One was even as far south as the Columbus-Animas highway on 11/1 (PJ).

<u>BLUE JAY</u> -- <u>unusual</u>: The above-mentioned invasion also included this species in unprecedented numbers:Up:to:5Ein Los Alamos (v. o., photo TM); up to 5 in Santa Fe throughout November (CR, LH); at Cedar Crest 10/17 (PSt); Cepilla Peak 9/28 and 10/10 (Tim Menerd); 1 or 2-in Albuquerque in October-November (BO, Elizabeth Jennings); 1 at Socorro 11/14 (F&RiS); 2 in Alamogordo (R&KJ); 2 or 3 in Socorro 10/7-11/23 (JS, PJ); 9 at Bitter L. 10/13 (PJ), and 1 at Dexter Fish Hatchery 11/18 (Bill Kepner).

<u>SCRUB JAY</u> -- Less comspicuous but noticeably higher numbers in such valley areas as Albuquerque, Socorro, Bosque NWR, Truth or Consequences end Las Cruces; in other such aouthern areas as Rattlesnake Springs, Dripping Springs and Redrock, and in the eastern plains at Portales and Boone's Draw (v. o.).

<u>BLACK-BILLED MAGPIE</u> -- At southern limits of range were 2 at 5 miles n. of San Felipe 9/21 (JH), and 6 at 3 miles s. of Bernalillo 9/30 (Jim McPhee).

<u>AMERICAN CROW</u> -- Large concentrations: 500 at Wagon Mound 9/27 (JH, RDi); a roost of about 10,000 at Albuquerque 10/22 (Bill Willard), most in October for four years, and about 7,000 in a long flight s. of Bosque NWR 11/10 (SWi), estimated by duration and rate of passage.

CHIHUAHUAN RAVEN -- Estimated 400 in one migrating flock at Carlabad 10/16, all gone by 11/11 (SW), and about 1,000 along highway between Lovington and Hobbs 10/13 (PJ).

<u>MOUNTAIN CHICKADEE</u> -- Moderate numbers in RGV lowlands. From mid-Saptember in Albuquerque (WH, Bill Willerd) and mid-Dotober further south. Unusual numbers at Rattlesnake Springs from 10/14 (CR+, PJ) up to a high of 14 on 10/28 (SW); 1 at Carlsbad Caverne NP 9/15 (PJ, JS).

PLAIN TITMOUSE --4 in Miller Canyon, More and Harding Counties, 9/25-26 (JH, RDi); 1 at McAllister L. 9/16 (CR) was out of place; 2 in Clanton Canyon 11/3 (PJ).

'89-4 (autumn '89)

RED-BREASTED NUTHATCH -- Widespread in low numbers in lowlands. Singles at Boone's Draw 9/13-14 (PJ, JS); Albuquerque 9/20 (BO); Percha Dam 10/21 (PSt); Dripplng Springs 9/28, 10/12 (EW+), and Ourling's farm 11/2 (BZ).

WHITE-BREASTED NUTHATCH -- 1 at Sevilleta NWR 10/26 (RT, PB) was first sighting there. 12 at Percha Dam 11/25 (DM); 1 et Ourling's farm 10/17 (BZ,KZ).

BROWN CREEPER -- 1 at Maxwell NWR 9/22 (CR); good numbers in Albuquerque in November and later (Bill Willard); 1 at Percha Dam 11/25 (DM), 1 in Gila National Forest 11/3 (PJ), and 1 at Carlsbad 11/9 (SW).

<u>SEDGE WREN</u> -- <u>unusual</u>: 1 at Isleta Lakes, Bernalillo County, 9/17 (GP, fide HS). Casual in N.M.

AMERICAN DIPPER -- 1 near Folsom 9/27 (JH) and 2 at Zuni 11/18 (DC) were probably migrants or wanderers. No winter reports at Zuni, but frequent at higher Bluewater L., about 50 miles distant.

GOLDEN-CROWNED KINGLET -- 1 in Santa Fe 10/22 (PI+); 3 at Bandelier NM 10/8 (CR); 11 in Sandia Mts. 10/22 and 11 there 11/11 (PSt); 2 at Frisco Hot Springs near Pleasanton 11/22 and 15 in Mogollon Mts.11/23 (JH).

RUBY-CROWNED KINGLET -- 58 at Oripping Springs 11/11 (EW, CSa). First fall arrivals: 8 to 10 at Boone's Orew 9/14 (PJ, JD); 2 at Bosque NWR 9/21 (RT, PB); 1 at D1d Refuge 9/21 (CSe); 1 at Mengas Springs 9/23 (RF).

BLUE-GRAY GNATCATCHER -- Singles at Portales and Boone's Draw 9/14 (PJ, JS), and at Bosque NWR 9/21 (RT, PB); 2 at Alma 9/9 (RF).

EASTERN BLUEBIRD -- unusual: 16 at Percha Oam SP 11/27 (DM) were a high number for the western edge of the species' migration/winter range.

TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRE -- 2 at Bell L. 10/12 and Caprock 10/13 (PJ).

SWAINSON'S THRUSH -- 1 at Corrales bosque 10/9 (80).

WOOD THRUSH -- unusual: 1\* was at the Gallinas campground in the Black Range 9/30 (Michael Resch), a rare occurence in N.M.

AMERICAN ROBIN -- Flock of 200 in Carlsbad 10/12 was large for the area.

VARIED THRUSH -- unusual: A vagrant individual lingered in Las Cruces 11/11-15 (LHS).

GRAY CATBIRO -- At least 3 at Percha Dam SP 9/27 (JB1).

SAGE THRASHER -- Small numbers in northwest, north central and southeast N.M. from 8/8 to 11/12 (v.o.).

BROWN THRASHER -- 1 at Bosque NWR 10/2 (TH, B0, JB1); 2 at Rattlesnake Springs 10/28 (B0).

CRISSAL THRASHER -- 1 in Sandia Mts. 10/8 (Alan Swain) and 11/2 (FGRS); 2 near Tularose 8/2-3 (JGNHt); 1 at Boone's Draw 9/15 (PJ).

AMERICAN FIFIT -- 15 at Johnson Mesa 9/26 (JH); 44 in Las Vegas NWR 9/24 and 39 there 11/4 (CR); 50 at Zuni 10/29 (OC); 11 at Sandia Crest 9/19 (PSt); 40 at Mangas Springs 10/18 (RF). and 20+ at Redrock 11/3 (PJ).

SPRAGUE'S PIPIT -- 1 at Bosque NWR 9/21 (RT, PB) was fairly well seen and described.

CEDAR WAXWING -- Small numbers statewide 8/14 to 11/5 (v.o.).

PHAINOPEPLA -- 1 at Sevilleta NWR 10/12 (RT) and 1 at Socorro 11/11-29 were at the northern limits of the species' renge.

NORTHERN SHRIKE -- 1 et Las Vegas NWR 11/4, 13 and 2 at Rio Grande Gorge 11/5 (CR+); 1 at Gresslands turf farm 11/4 (TH).

'89-4 (autumn '89)

WHITE-EYED VIREO -- unusual: 1 singing and very well seen at Rattlesnake Springs 9/15 (PJ) provided one of the very few records for N.M.

BELL'S VIREO -- 3 at Rattlesnake Springs 8/2 (Jan Lloyd, SW).

SOLITARY VIRED -- 1 reported as solitarius at Les Vegas NWR 9/12, 16 (CR); 1 cassinnii at Albuquerque 8/25 and 9/6 (PSt); 1 cassinnii in Sandia Mts. 8/20 and 9/23 (HS); 3 at Boone's Draw 8/14 (PJ, JS); 1 well-described colitarius and 1 plumbeus at Rattlesneke Springs 10/28 (SW).

WARBLING VIREO -- 2 at Albuquerque 9/5 (Bill Willard); 5+ at Boone's Draw 9/14 (PJ, JS).

RED-EYED VIREO -- 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 9/24 (ML).

TENNESSEE WARBLER -- 1 well described northeast of Las Cruces 9/24 (CSa).

<u>ORANGE-CROWNED WARBLER</u> -- Arrived 8/23 at Mangas Springs (RF); 20+ at Boone's Draw 9/14 (PJ, JS); 6 at Durling's farm 11/2 was very late for so many (BZ); 1 at Percha Dam 11/22 (DM), and 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 1D/15 (CR+).

NASHVILLE WARBLER -- 10 in western N.M. from 8/26 to 9/23 (v.o.); late were singles at Mangas Springs 11/3 (PJ) and Percha Dam 11/22 (DM).

VIRGINIA'S WARBLER -- Scattered reports from 8/11 to 9/23 (v.o.).

LUCY'S WARBLER -- 1 singing at Bosque NWR 8/25 (PJ, JS).

YELLOW WARBLER -- Among later reports were 1D at Boone's Draw 9/14 (PJ, JS) and 2 at Mangas Springs 9/17 (RF). 1 reported at Percha Dam 11/2 (DM) lacked details; this would be the latest for New Mexico by about a month.

CHESTNUT-SIDED WARBLER -- 1, probably a female, at Las Vegas NWR 8/31 (PSt) was well described.

YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLER -- 2 at Boone's Draw 9/14 (PJ, JS).

BLACK-THROATED GRAY WARBLER -- 2 at Percha Dam 11/22 (DM) were late.

TOWNSEND'S WARBLER -- 16 reported statewide 8/20-9/16 (v.o.).

HERMIT WARBLER -- No details for 1 reported at Capilla Peak 8/1 (Brett Ewald, Tim Menard, fide CSa); locale is east of the usual range.

BLACK-THROATED GREEN WARBLER -- A very high count of 3 at Aguirre Springs 9/29 (CSa).

BLACK-AND-WHITE WARBLER -- 2 in Albuquerque 9/24 (CAH).

AMERICAN REDSTART -- 1 on Maxwell NWR 8/3 (DC); 2 at Las Vegas NWR 9/16 and 1 on 9/24 (CR); 1 at Boone's Oraw 9/14 (PJ, JS); 1 in Gila Bird Habitatho details, 9/17 (SM); 2 at La Cueva Park, Organ Mts., 9/23 (EW+), and 1 at Dripping Springs 9/24 (KSk, fide CSa).

PROTHONOTARY WARBLER -- 1 maie in Black Rock Canyon 10/21 (DC) was well described.

WORM-EATING WARBLER -- 1 at Las Vegas NWR 9/12 (CR); well described, sketch.

SWAINSON'S WARBLER -- unusual: 1 was seen at Oasis SP, Portales, and reasonably well described (PJ, JS). This is only the second sighting for this elusive species in New Mexico, far west of its normal range, and one of very few for the West.

 $\underline{\text{OVENBIRD}}$  -- Singles at Boone's Draw 9/14 (PJ, JS) and on 10/9 at Corrales (B0+).

NORTHERN WATERTHRUSH -- 1 at Alamogordo 8/10 (GSmi).

'89-4 (autumn '89)

KENTUCKY WARBLER -- 1 very well described and photographed east of Zuni 11/24 (SI). Extremely late for this species.

MacGILLIVRAY'S WARBLER -- Arrived at Mangas Springs 8/22 (RF); 1 at Zuni 10/7 (DC).

WILSON'S WARBLER -- Common as usual. Reported from 8/8 at Zuni (DC) to 10/15 at Rattlesnake Springs and vicinity (CR), with a high of 100+ at Boone's graw and Portales 9/14 (JS, PJ).

RED-FACED WARBLER -- 1 in Magdalena Mts. 8/10 (PJ).

PAINTED REDSTART -- 1 at Bandelier NM 10/8 was well north of the normal range (CR); 1 at Water Canyon in early September (PJ) and 1 in Apache Canyon 8/31 (JH).

YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT -- Latest report was 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 9/15 (PJ, JS).

OLIVE WARBLER -- & female and an immature male in Sheridan Canyon, Mogollon Mts., 11/23 (JH).

HEPATIC TANAGER -- 1 at Bandelier NM 10/8 (CR) was somewhat late.

WESTERN TANAGER -- 4 at Mangas Springs 8/6 (RF) were early migrants.

NORTHERN CARDINAL -- 2 at Rattlesnake Springs during period (SW).

PYRRHULOXIA -- Singles near Socorro 11/10 (BO, Tanya Reveed) and at Bosque NWR 11/11-17 (RT, SWi) were northerly. 3 at Redrock 11/3 (PJ).

ROSE-BREASTED GROSBEAK -- 1 at Bosque NWR 9/8 (RT, PB). 1 at Silver City 11/29 (HW, RF) was very late.

BLACK-HEADED GROSBEAK -- 1 at Santa Fe 10/9 (LH) was a bit late.

PAINTED BUNTING -- Westerly singles at Albuquerque 8/26-27 (CAH+) and at Bosque NWR 9/24 (DC).

DICKCISSEL -- West-of usual range were 1 at Albuquerque 9/2 (CAH+) and 1\* at Bosque NWR 9/24 (DC).

CASSIN'S SPARROW -- 1 or 2 at Carlsbad Caverns NP 10/15 (CR) were late. 1 on 9/22 at Owen's farm, where seldom seen (BZ).

RUFOUS-CROWNED SPARROW -- breeding: Adult feeding fledgling at Gila 8/26 (SM).

AMERICAN TREE SPARROW -- 6 at Las Vegas NWR 11/14 -- about the same arrival date as previous year -- and 23 cn 11/18 (CR).

<u>CLAY-COLORED SPARROW</u> -- At Las Vegas NWR, 1 on 9/12 and 16, and 2 on 9/24 (CR). Up to 6 at Mangas Springs 9/16-26 (RF). Numerous in southern Doña Ana County, with a high of 30 at Owen's farm 9/12 (BZ) and the latest single on 10/6 (CSa).

BREWER'S SPARROW -- 42 banded in Albuquerque 8/6-9/10 (CAH+).

FIELD SPARROW -- unusual: 2 in Hondo Canyon, Sandia Mts., 9/4 (GP).... 1 at Clayton 10/20 (WC).

LARK BUNTING -- A male at Mangas Springs 8/8 (RF) was early.

GRASSHDPPER SPARROW --Many summered in Clayton area (WC). 3 at Maxwell NWR 8/11 and 1 at Las Vegas NWR 9/16 (CR). 1 or 2 at Rattlesnake Springs 10/28 (80).

FOX SPARROW -- 1\* grayish (presumably <u>schistacea</u>) at La Cueva Park, Organ Mte.,10/7 (EW, Drucilla Seward).

SWAMP SPARROW -- Singles at Las Vegas NWR 11/4 (CR), Bosque NWR 11/11 (SWi, KC), and at Mangas Springs 11/4 for second year in a row (RF). GOLDEN-CROWNED SPARROW -- 1 at Bosque NWR 11/4 (RT).

WHITE-CROWNED SPARROW -- A few early at Bosque NWR 8/26 (PJ, JS).

HARRIS' SPARROW -- Singles at Las Veges NWR 11/18 (CR), Redrock 11/24 (TH), and Las Cruces 10/18\* (Tim Lawton) and 11/3-30\*\* (CSa).

<u>DARK-EYED JUNCO</u> -- unusual: 1 white-winged at Cedar Crest 11/3-5 (PSt), and 1 slate-colored in Sandia Heights 11/4 (FSRS).

McCOWN'S LONGSPUR -- 3 at Grasslands turf farm 11/10 (B0).

CHESTNUT-COLLARED LONGSPUR -- 2 at McAllister L. 9/25 (JH). Only 7 at Grasslands 11/10 (B0), much fewer than in recent years.

EASTERN MEADOWLARK -- Again in Embudito Canyon in the Sandia Mts., with at least 3 singing 10/15 (HS).

YELLOW-HEADED BLACKBIRD -- Up to 10 near Zuni through 11/30 (DC).

<u>GREAT-TAILED GRACKLE</u> -- 20 at Zuni 11/4 (DC) were last of season. Singles at Taoa 11/5 (CR) and Santa Fe 11/18 (JH). 28 at Mangas Springs 11/25 (RF).

COMMON GRACKLE -- Up to 25 in Socorro from 1D/20 to end of period (PJ, JS).

BRONZED COWBIRD -- 1 juvenile in Socorro 8/4 (PJ).

ROSY FINCH -- Up to 24 brown-capped and at least 2 gray-crowned on Sandia Creat 11/24 (PSt).

PINE GROSBEAK -- 3\* at Santa Fe ski basin 8/13 (SW).

CASSIN'S FINCH -- Appeared in Albuquerque in late September (F&RS). 2 in Santa Fe 11/4 (JH) and 2 in Socorro 11/12 (JS) were first of season there.

RED CROSSBILL -- unusual: 1 in Albuquerque 9/17 (WH).

PINE SISKIN -- Widespread at lower elevations, including 200+ at Las Vegaa NWR 9/24 (CR), 7 to 8 at Caprock and 8 to 9 at Bell L. 10/11 (PJ), 43 at Bosque NWR 11/4 (RT), 10+ at San Simon Cianega 10/25-31 (RDi), and 24 at Rattlesnake Springs 10/14 (CR+).

LESSER GOLDFINCH -- breeding: Nestlings at Las Vages NWR 8/20 (CR) and at Mangas Springs 9/17 (RF)....1 near Pilar 11/5 was late (CR).

LAWRENCE'S GOLDFINCH -- unusual: 3 at San Simon Cienega 10/25-31 (RDi); a rare bird in New Mexico.

AMERICAN GOLDFINCH -- 2 at Las Vegaa NWR 8/20 (CR) and 2 at Bosque NWR 9/19 (OC) were early.

EVENING GROSBEAK -- Widespread in and near montane areas, including Zuni (DC) and Santa Fe (JH+).Lowland records from Las Vegas NWR 1D/26 (CR), Sevilleta NWR 1D/26 (PB, RT), Socorro 11/4 (JS), Bosque NWR 11/11 (SWi, KC), Dripping Springs 1D/8 (KSk+), Rattlesnake Springs 10/14 (CR) and a very early juvenile with 18 Cedar Waxwings 9/6-15 (RF). In late November, 10 to 24 at Silver City (DZ).
